New Transit Centre opening December 2, 2024

In conjunction with the development of Heavy Metal Place, the City of Spruce Grove is building a new Spruce Grove Transit Centre to meet the growing transportation needs of our community, which will open to transit riders on Monday, December 2, 2024.

Located at 50 Westwind Drive, the Transit Centre will serve as the hub for all commuter service (Route 560) into and out of Spruce Grove and be a regular stop for the On-Demand Local Transit service, providing patrons of Heavy Metal Place another way to get there and enjoy all its amenities.

It will provide comfort and convenience for transit users, including parking stalls for Park & Ride users at no cost, a passenger drop off/pick up zone, bike racks, and a heated shelter where riders can wait for their bus.

Construction of Heavy Metal Place will still be underway at this time, with an anticipated facility opening in early 2025. This will not impact the operation of the Transit Centre or ability to access Park & Ride parking stalls, but the number of parking stalls will temporarily be limited to approximately 50 stalls in the southeast corner of the site. Once Heavy Metal Place is complete, a total of 600 parking stalls will become available for Park & Ride users at no cost.

By locating these two major facilities close together, the City can maximize the land usage and provide shared parking for both Heavy Metal Place and the Transit Centre.

Winter Emergency Response returns for 2024/2025 season

The Winter Emergency Response provides cold weather support for vulnerable residents when the temperature drops below -20°C (including windchill) for at least 4 to 6 hours. The response includes Daytime Warming Spaces and the Late Night Café, both of which provide a warm, safe place to rest, hot meals, and access to supports and cold weather supplies. The Winter Emergency Response runs from November to March and is a partnership between several Tri Region partner organizations including the City of Spruce Grove. Learn more at sprucegrove.org/WER.

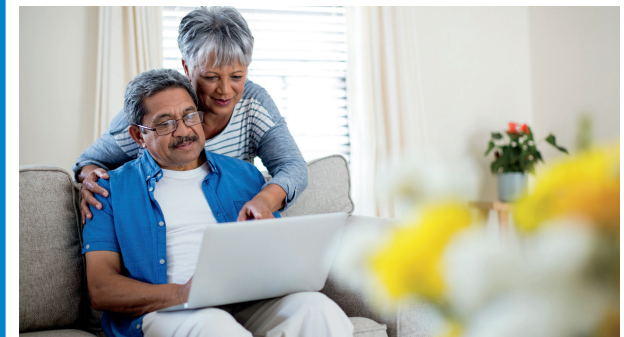
Alternately, residents can submit a statement or a question to be read on their behalf by emailing cityclerk@sprucegrove.org until the Public Input Session is complete.
