SNOW REMOVAL IN SPRUCE GROVE



When the snow and ice arrives in Spruce Grove each winter, we all have an important role to play in keeping our community safe and accessible.

Public walkways

Public walkways in Spruce Grove are cleared on a priority system.

PRIORITY 1A

Public walkways adjacent to City-owned buildings or transit stops are cleared within 24 hours.

PRIORITY 1B

Walkways along arterial and collector roads are cleared within 48 hours.

PRIORITY 2

Walkways in parks, around stormwater facilities, and in forested areas are cleared based on City resources.

Did you know?

On average, crews clear more than 460 laned kilometres of roads each snowfall — that's more roadway than it takes to drive from Spruce Grove to Banff!



Give crews room to work

During snow clearing operations, heavy equipment is used to clear streets. Please slow down, give crews plenty of space, and use caution when passing.



Property owner responsibilities



Clear sidewalks in front of your property and parking pad within 48 hours of snowfall.



Keep snow on your property, not on roads, alleys, or public spaces.



Use sand or salt for traction. During the winter months, free sand is available for personal use at the Public Works Facility, located at 21 Century Close.



Keep sidewalks free of tripping hazards, such as electrical cords.



Clear around hydrants and utility boxes for emergency access.



Move vehicles and other obstructions, like hockey and basketball nets, when snow removal signs are posted.



If you use a driveway aid (also referred to as a curb ramp), ensure it's removed during the winter months to support efficient snow removal.
