2026 Property Assessment notices have been mailed

Annual property assessment notices were mailed on January 29. If you own property in Spruce Grove, you should receive your 2026 assessment by mail by the end of February.

This annual assessment notice will show the market value of your property, which will be used to calculate the annual taxes on that property. This process, which follows guidelines established by the provincial government, helps ensure taxes are distributed in a fair and equitable way, where owners of property with similar market values pay similar amounts of property taxes. While the assessed value of a property is used to calculate property taxes, an assessment notice is not the same as a tax bill, which will be mailed in May 2026.

For detailed information on your assessment notice, and the complaint process if you do not agree with your assessed value, please read the back of your assessment notice to submit a complaint by April 7, 2026.

If you have questions about your 2026 assessment notice, failed to receive it, or want to discuss your assessment with an assessor, please call 780-962-7634 ext. 119 or email propertytaxes@sprucegrove.org. All meetings with an assessor will be scheduled as a phone or virtual meeting.


