2026 Property Assessment complaint deadline is April 7

Annual property assessment notices for 2026 were mailed January 29. The back of your assessment notice includes detailed information on property tax assessments and the complaint process if you do not agree with your assessed value. The assessment complaint deadline is April 7, 2026.

Winter organics collection reminder

Learn how to spot and safely remove black knot

What is black knot? Black knot is a fungal disease that causes an infected plant to develop greenish brown to black swellings.

The disease affects a wide range of prunus species, including plum, cherry and apricot trees in Alberta. The City regularly inspects trees for black knot on public property. Maintenance of trees on private and residential properties is the responsibility of the property owner.
